Materials

8 UNIQUE FABRICS for this quilt!

- i) Treetop TG48 -- 1.5 yards
 - ii) Night Sky TG57 -- 1 yard
 - iii) Stepping Stones TG58 -- 1 yard
 - iv) Sunset Veranda TG47 -- 1 yard
 - v) Lakeside TG54 1.5 yards
 - vi) Kika TG53 -- 1.25 yards
 - vii) TG49 Gossip Tree -- 1.25 yards
 - viii) ChaCha TG50 -- 1.25 yards
- p l u s : 5.5 yards for backing and
¾ yards for binding

Cutting Instructions

5 different shapes

- a) 4½" SQUARES
- b) RECTANGLE 20½"x4½"
- c) 10½" square
- d) large square 20½x20½"
- e) RECTANGLE 20½x4½"

From fabric:

- A) TG48 Treetop - cut 2d, 2b, 4c, 2e, 8a
- B) TG57 NightSky 2b, 1d, 4c, 2e, 4a
- C) TG58 Stepping Stones 2d, 2e, 2b, 8a
- D) Sunset Veranda TG47 1d, 4c, 4b, 4e, 4a
- E) Lakeside TG54 4b, 4e, 8c
- F) Kika TG53 1d, 2b, 2e, 4c, 4a
- G) TG49 Gossip Tree 2d, 4c, 8a
- H) ChaCha TG50 8c, 2b, 2e

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Inspired by a bedroom I once had with enormous handpainted harlequin diamonds in ivory and taupe... This is my idea of a Romantic quilt - thus the 'Romance Novel'. So curl up with this quilt, stop by the book store, grab some chocolate truffles and make a cup of tea! Ooh, doesn't that sound good? Gotta make the quilt first!

Making the Blocks

The Quilt is made of 5 blocks, attached is a 'map' using the listed fabrics. Refer to this as you make each block.

- Beginning with the large square 'd', pin 4 of the 10½" squares labeled 'c' onto each corner of the large square 'd'. Tip:- Fold each square diagonally in half, wrong sides together and press a crease along the diagonal. Now match the corner point of the square, now looking like a triangle, to the corner of the large rectangle shape 'd'. Unfold the small square, and pin across the crease onto the larger square base. Repeat for the corner diagonally opposite the first one you just did. Sew each in place, and trim the excess triangle off both the large square and the smaller squares. Press both seams. Repeat for the remaining 2 corners.

- Pin shape 'b' rectangle onto each side of the combination piece you just made, stitch in place and press.

- Pin a 4½" square 'a' on the short ends of the rectangle 'e'. Stitch both on and press.

- Pin these combination strips you just created onto the top and bottom of the larger block. Stitch and press seams. You now have one complete block. Repeat for all 9 blocks.

-Using the map, place the blocks in order, then stitch the first row of blocks together beginning with the far top left block, then the middle top block and the far right top block. Repeat with the 2nd and the 3rd rows.

- Stitch the rows together across the width of the quilt.

For the backing of the quilt, choose one of the fabrics, and bind the quilt with a simple binding, metering your corners.

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
