Fabric requirements—(you will have leftovers—try incorporating them into the back!!)

- FAH01 Berry – 1 fat quarter
- FAH05 Sunset – 1 fat quarter
- FAH02 Grass – 1 fat quarter
- FAH05 Marine – 1/3 yard
- FAH03 Berry – 1 fat quarter
- FAH06 Moonlight – 1 fat eighth
- FAH02 Dusk – 1 yard
- FAH03 Jewel – 1 fat quarter
- FAH02 Sweet – 1 fat quarter
- FAH01 Sea – 1 fat quarter
- FAH04 Sea – 1 fat quarter
- FAH02 Sun – 1 fat quarter
- FAH04 Heather – 1 fat quarter
- FAH06 Glow – 1 fat quarter
- FAH07 Plum – 1 yard
- FAH07 Saffron – 1 yard
- 3 yards background fabric of your choice. (or less if you include your scraps from the front)
- 60"x 60" batting

In all instructions 1/4" seams are assumed throughout this pattern.

Cutting instructions for each block (Make 4 blocks total: A, B, C, and D)

- Cut (1) 4.5" x 4.5" square for piece A.
- Cut (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles for pieces B.
- Cut (2) 2.5" x 8.5" rectangles for pieces C.
- Cut (4) 4.5" x 4.5" squares for pieces D.
- Cut (8) 1.5" x 1.5" squares for pieces E.
- Cut (8) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles for pieces F.
- Cut (4) 2.5" x 8.5" rectangles for pieces G.
- Cut (8) 2.5" x 2.5" rectangles for pieces H.
- Cut (4) 4.25" x 6.25" Rectangles for pieces I and IR  
....cutting two of these once diagonally from the upper right hand corner to the lower left hand corner as shown:



and cutting the other two once diagonally from the upper left hand corner to the lower right hand corner as shown.



This will result in 4 I pieces



and 4 IR pieces



- Cut (4) of Template J. *(be sure to print template at 100%, when I was testing this pattern, my printer automatically made it 91% and that did not work, I had to change the settings to 100%, then it worked fine)*

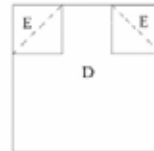
Fabric Key for each block

- Block A --- cut A square from FAH01Berry, Pieces B and C from FAH05Sunset, D squares from FAH02Grass, E,F, & G pieces from FAH01Berry, H, I, and IR pieces from FAH05Marine, J piece from FAH03Berry.
- Block B --- cut A square from FAH06Moonlight, Pieces B and C from FAH02Dusk, D squares from FAH005Sunset, E,F, & G pieces from FAH03Jewel, H, I, and IR pieces from FAH02Sweet, J piece from FAH01Sea.
- Block C --- cut A square from FAH05Marine, Pieces B and C from FAH02Sweet, D squares from FAH03Jewel, E,F, & G pieces from FAH02Grass, H, I, and IR pieces from FAH03Berry, J piece from FAH04Sea.
- Block D --- cut A square from FAH04Sea, Pieces B and C from FAH02Sun, D squares from FAH01Sea, E,F, & G pieces from FAH04Heather, H, I, and IR pieces from FAH02Dusk, J piece from FAH06Glow.

Block Piecing directions

*(special note: When this quilt was originally pieced, it was done in a slightly different manner, but rest assured, these directions will give you the same look, and might even be a little easier)*

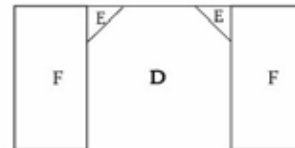
1. Sew B pieces to the top and bottom of A and press. Then sew C pieces to both sides of B/A/B unit and press.
2. Place 2 E squares (right side down) onto the upper two corners of a D square (right side



up) Sew diagonally across the E squares as shown:  
press E square corners towards the D square corners as shown:



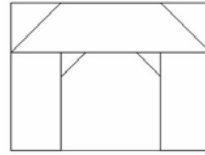
trim the D and E corners that are behind the pressed back E corner to take away the bulk.



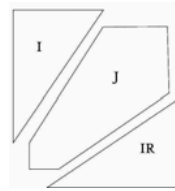
3. Sew 2 F pieces to the sides of the D/E unit as shown:
4. Sew 2 H squares to the G rectangle in the same manner that you sewed the E squares to



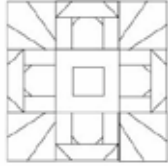
the D square resulting in this:



5. Sew the G/F unit to the D/E/F unit creating this:



6. Take an I and an IR unit and sew to the J piece as shown:  
 7. Now sew all nine units together referring to the photo of the quilt and this diagram:



#### Cutting for Sashing and Cornerstones

- Cut 9 2.5" x 2.5" squares of [FAH07Plum](#) for cornerstones
- Cut 12 2.5" x 20.5" strips of [FAH07Saffron](#) for sashing strips
- Cut and piece as you go enough 2.5" strips of [FAH07Plum](#) to equal two strips 2.5" x 46.5" and two strips 2.5" x 50.5" for border strips.

#### Putting it all together

1. Using the photo as a guide sew and press the sashing strips, cornerstones, and Blocks A,B,C, and D together in rows and then sew the rows together in standard fashion.
2. Sew the 46.5" border strips to the top and bottom and press.
3. Sew the 50.5" border strips to the sides and press.

#### Quilt the top and then bind it with your favorite method using [FAH02Dusk](#)

Don't forget to include a label!!
