# Poodle

## Materials

Poodle Fabrics by Jennifer Paganelli for FreeSpirit

1 yd JP 36 Mustard (small medallion)

2 yds JP 35 pink (paisley)

½ yd JP 36 yellow (small medallion)

3/8 yd of 10 different Poodle prints or ¼ yard 12 different Poodle prints.

This quilt contains:

JP 33 mustard (diamond geometric)

JP 33 fuchsia (diamond geometric)

JP 34 yellow (rose)

JP 34 blue (rose)

JP 35 yellow (paisley)

JP 35 blue (paisley)

JP 36 yellow (small medallion)

JP 36 blue (small medallion)

JP 37 pink (floral stripe)

JP 37 green (floral stripe)

¼ yd S01 pink (solid)

3 ½ yds backing fabric

50" x 62" piece quilt batting

Sewing thread to match fabrics

Quilting thread to match fabrics

Template plastic

## Tools:

Sewing Machine

Iron

Scissors

Needles and pins

Ruler and pen or pencil

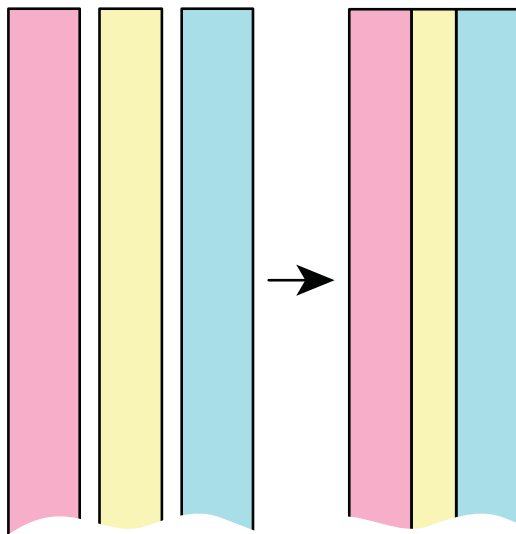
Rotary Cutter, ruler and cutting mat – Optional

## Cutting

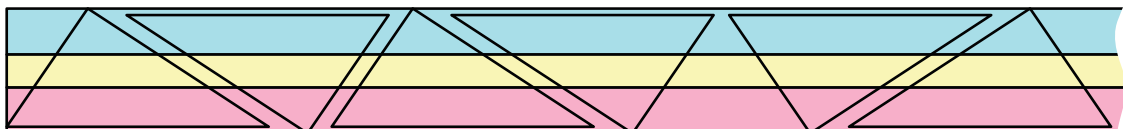
Make a plastic template for the star points and the triangles. You can trace the templates onto the fabric and cut them out using scissors or a rotary cutter and ruler. If you are careful you can cut directly around thick plastic templates with a small rotary cutter.

1. Cut 48 star points from mustard small medallion fabric.
2. From pink paisley, cut two 59" x 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ " side borders and two 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ " top and bottom borders.
3. Cut four 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide crosswise strips. Cut two strips to 36  $\frac{1}{2}$ " for top and bottom inner borders. From remaining fabric, cut two 21" strips.
4. For binding, cut six crosswise strips 2  $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide. Trim ends diagonally using a 45 degree angle.

5. From remaining fabrics, for each strip pieced unit, you will cut two 2" and 1 3/4" crosswise strips from three different fabrics. Look at the color photo for ideas for combining the fabrics in each unit. Stitch each 2" strip to one long edge of the 1 3/4" center strip with right sides together using 1/4" seam allowance. You will need to make about 16 – 18 strip pieced units varying the prints and colors combinations of the fabrics.

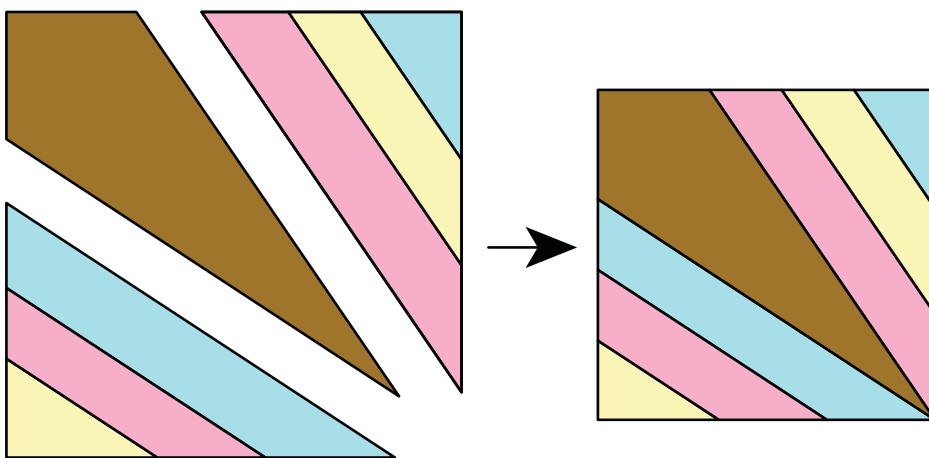


6. From each strip pieced unit, cut 5 or 6 triangles matching the lines to the seams of the strips. You will need a total of 96 triangles- cut 48 triangles with the template as shown and 48 triangles with the template reversed.

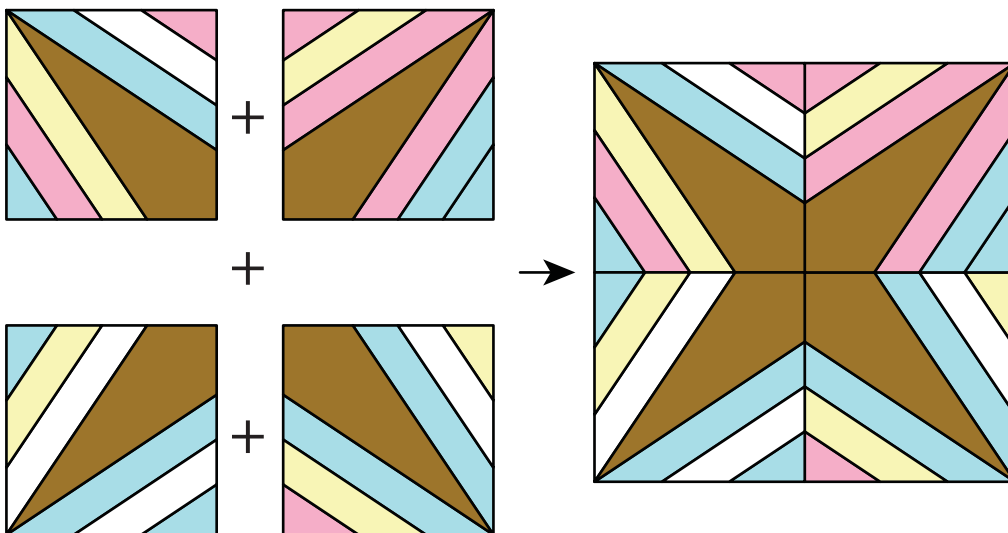


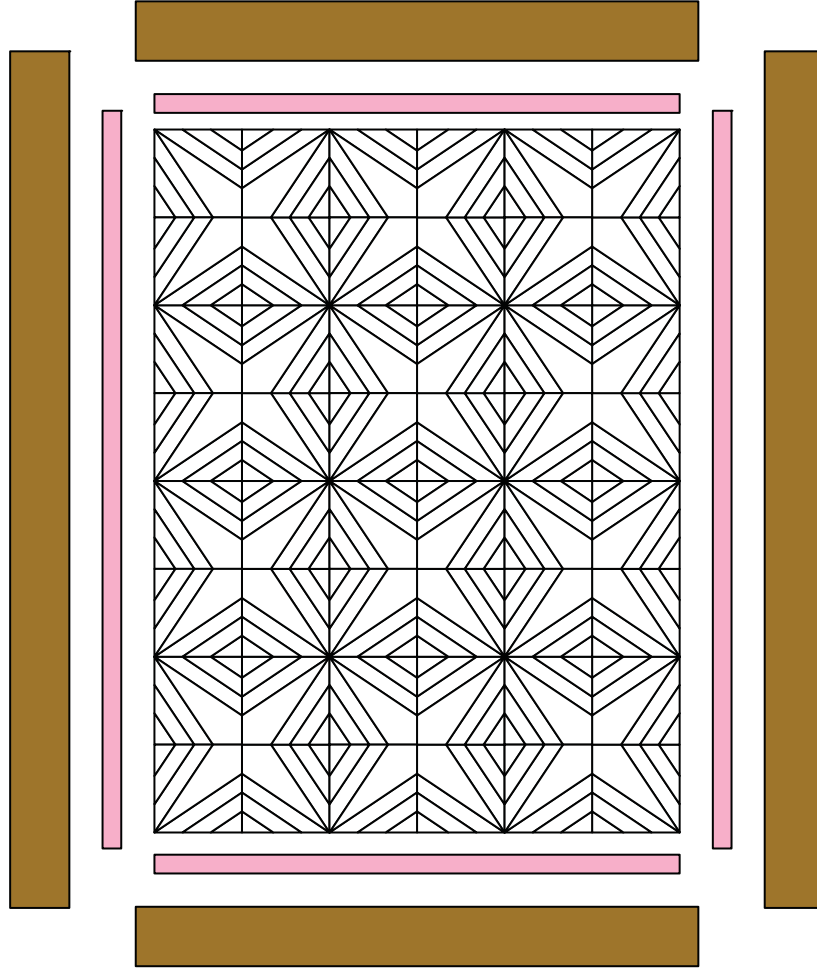
## Directions

1. Arrange the star points and triangles to make twelve 4-point star blocks. Look at the color photo for ideas on how to arrange the triangles varying the color and pattern in the combined fabrics. Stitch all seams right sides together using  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Stitch triangles to each long edge of the star point.



2. For each block, stitch the star point units together in pairs matching seams. Then stitch the pairs together to make each block.





3. Stitch the blocks together in three rows of four blocks each. Then stitch the rows together to make the quilt center.
4. Stitch the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Stitch the 21" strips to the ends of the remaining inner borders. Stitch these side inner borders to the quilt center.
5. Stitch the top and bottom borders to the inner borders. Then stitch the side borders to the sides of the quilt.

Layer, quilt and bind.
